

## ASA T. HILL MEMORIAL AWARD

The **Asa T. Hill Memorial Award** was created by the NSHS Foundation in 1975 "to recognize an individual or organization for an outstanding research project or interpretation of an archeological site or sites in the field of Great Plains archeology." Consideration is given to publications, exhibits, or on-site interpretations. The award provides a plaque, a one-year membership with the Nebraska State Historical Society, and a cash prize of \$300, which comes from the NSHS Foundation miscellaneous operating fund. There is no requirement that the award be presented annually. Past recipients of the Hill award, have been professional and amateur archeologists. The Director/CEO of the NSHS and the State Archaeologist jointly nominate/select the recipient.
