

NEBRASKA PRESERVATION AWARD

The **Nebraska Preservation Award** was created in 1988 to recognize significant achievements in historic preservation in Nebraska by an individual or organization. The award is given for one of two categories: "brick and mortar projects," or "individual or group achievements." The Director/CEO (state historic preservation officer) along with the Historic Preservation Office staff and the Historic Preservation Advisory Board, nominate/select the recipient. The award consists of a plaque and a lifetime membership with the Nebraska State Historical Society.
